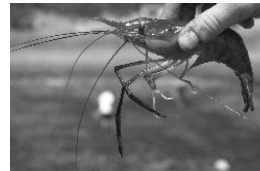

The Ohio Aquaculture Association was formed on July 12, 1990. The goals and objectives of the Association are as follows:

- Provide for the scientific and educational advancement of members
- Encourage scientific research into aquaculture
- Extend and develop public interest in the discipline
- Assist in promoting and marketing of aquaculture products
- Promote the exchange of information and technology among members

Highlights

Provided input into the revision of the 5-Year Plan for Ohio Aquaculture on behalf of the association's members. This update was drafted by a committee of industry representatives selected by the Ohio Department of Agriculture (ODA).

Co-sponsored and played an instrumental part in putting together a statewide meeting where fish farmers were presented the draft of the revised plan. ODA Director Robert Boggs presented the draft, and attendees were able to provide their input to ODA representatives before the plan is finalized.

Co-sponsored and participated in the first tri-state aquaculture meeting with West Virginia and Kentucky Aquaculture Associations in January 2010. Over 100 fish farmers and industry leaders attended the event and trade show.

Created two \$1,000 scholarships to be awarded to students working on aquaculture projects or enrolled in an aquaculture program in an Ohio university or college as a sophomore, junior or senior.

Members serve on the Aquatic Animal Health Advisory Committee for the Ohio Department of Agriculture and provide sponsorship of the conference call meetings.

Members represent aquaculture on multiple OSU, NCRAC, ODNR and other advisory committees.

Sponsored OSU's Aquaculture Field Day and Introduction to Shrimp Farming workshop.

Active*	\$35.00
