

Local Organizations Work Together to Protect Rivers Portage SWCD

Storm water run-off during rain events transports pollutants like lawn fertilizer, herbicides, pesticides, soil sediment and even sewage from poorly functioning home septic systems into our ditches and streams. Portage County has an abundance of freshwater resources being polluted during rain events as a result of poor land management decisions. Local organizations are teaming up to provide multiple opportunities for local residents to learn more about how they can better manage their landscapes to protect our fragile waters.

ent Environmental Council has provided funds for an "Edible Riparians" workshop which will be held in May in cooperation with the Kent Parks and Recreation 26th Annual River Days Celebration. The workshop will be held on May 21st from 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM at the Portage SWCD office, 6970 State Route 88, Ravenna, OH 44266. The Portage County SWCD and the Portage County Master Gardeners will co-host this public event where participants will learn about the important role plants play in maintaining the healthy function of land surrounding water, also referred to as riparian areas. Our workshop will focus on edible food plants that grow well in riparian zones. Key speaker, John Kelsey, nut grower and researcher will provide a presentation about growing hazelnuts. Hazelnuts are well-suited for riparian zones, as are all the plants we will be learning about in our workshop. Also joining us will be Larry Rogers, an avid NA pawpaw grower and researcher. Bob Stehli of Wintergreen Tree Farm will also be on hand to answer questions about growing blueberries. To promote

these healthy soil and water practices, workshop attendees will receive generous plant packages including crop-grade hazelnuts, elderberries, blueberries and aronias. Conservation grade paw paws will also be included in the plant packages. There is a participant cost-share fee of \$20.00 for this event.



Cincinnati Nature Center Continues to Improve the NA Pawpaw Grove at Long

Branch Farm

The Cincinnati Nature Center has been improving a native two acre pawpaw grove on its Long Branch Farm and Trails site near Goshen, OH since the spring of 2003. We continue to add more opportunities for guests in the form of "learn while you work" projects. In May 2015, we offered a grafting and invasive plant removal day in the pawpaw grove.


After a brief demonstration by Ron Powell, volunteer grafters were sent out to try their hand at grafting in the grove. A September survey of their work



showed that about 40% of the grafts were successful. While this success rate is relatively low, work projects like invasive plant removal, grafting and leading tour groups in the pawpaw grove help volunteers become invested in the or-

ganization and the project. Invested volunteers are more likely to volunteer in the future. Every September, we offer guided pawpaw grove hikes for our members, homeschool groups and a native edibles foraging group.
